PNEHS Celebrates Veterans' Day with a Free Breakfast for Vets

It was November 11th and Veterans' Day..... and what a day it was! The Sand Bar was decorated in Red, White and Blue flags, balloons and glitter. Forty four Browns Point, Dash Point and Northeast Tacoma Veterans gathered for a hearty breakfast presented by the **Browns Point Diner** and Points Northeast Historical Society.

Some veterans already knew each other, but everyone met new friends. They had so much in common. In one case two KC135 pilots and a KC135 maintenance supervisor met for the first time. Their conversation took off immediately. This was the case throughout the morning. Three large panels told the military stories (with photos) of forty one local men and three local women. Included were three veterans, now deceased, who were confined in Prisoner of War Camps: Capt. Clare Cline was a Prisoner of War during WWII in Germany where he used his talent and ingenuity to build a violin. Sounds impossible but it is true. Capt. Willard Carroll Johnson was a Prisoner of War in the Pacific and actually survived the Bataan Death March. Tech. Sergeant John D. Melvin, Sr. was also a Prisoner of War in Germany in Stalag Luft IV which included a forced march for 89 days.

Everyone represented on these panels served with honor and there are so many of you out there who should also be represented. Whether you served for a year or thirty years or you are a private or a general, your tour was very important. In this newsletter you will find our military questionnaire which we invite you to fill out and submit to us with a military photo for our files and for a continuation of displays which will be getting larger and larger throughout this coming year. If you served you should be in this display because we are all so proud of you. We will be displaying our growing Hall of Honor at our events and the Salmon Bake!

A big thank you to **Shane and Tanja Leek and the staff of the Browns Point Diner** for going all out for our Veterans!

And another big thank you to our PNEHS volunteers for making this such a special event.

Restoration Grants and Historic Register to Enhance Lighthouse Park

The Pierce County Council approved our Preservation Grant of \$11,700 (plus our matching money) to restore the Generator Building, which sits in front of the Lighthouse. It used to house the backup generator for the lighthouse. Another grant, for \$10,000 (plus \$10,000 Metro Parks matching money) from the Lodging Tax Funds is pending and should be acted on in December.

In addition, the Council approved our application to be on the Pierce County Register of Historic Sites which will come with a bronze plaque to be displayed on the property. This adds to our past recognitions as National and State Historic Sites.

The Oil House restoration has been underway, with the metal siding having been removed and some wood structure repaired. The new metal and distinctive architectural features and replicated front door will be in place soon. Grants from Washington Preservation Sivinski Fund (\$1,000) and a Lighthouse License Plate Fund (\$6,500) plus money and volunteer labor from Points Northeast Historical Society supported this project.

Thanks to **Greg Hoffman Construction** and **Jim Stice's Specialty Metal** for directing the project and **Bruce Fierke**, who helped with the fabrication of replica door hardware. **Gene Grulich**, a well-known lighthouse restoration architect, was a big help in guiding us through the planning process. **Metro Parks** provided help in the permitting process.

The next project in 2018-19 will be the restoration of the Lighthouse itself, replicating the original windows and door, replacing the ugly chain-link fence with something more aesthetically pleasing, and returning a replica lantern atop the tower.




